## A MESSAGE FROM FR. MARIA

Welcome to Our Lady of Peace Annual Report. I hope and pray that the information in this report will give you a snapshot of the growth of our parish over the past year. Please take a look inside for more details. I would like to bring to your notice the modification of Our Lady of Peace Parish after the merger of three churches( St. Patrick, St. Theresa and St. Antony) in September 1, 2018 and later merger of Our Lady of Fatima on January 8, 2023 by Bishop Robert Harris and Bishop Chritian respectively.

Since then our parish has large boundary modified by Bishop Christian (CIC, canon 515 # 2). The north side of the Saint John River at Portobello Road to Noonan through the Nashwask Valley to Ward's Settlement, west to Stanley, then northwest of the transmission line to Birdton, down to Burtt's Corner and Keswick along highway 105 to Douglas along the Saint John River to include Nashwaasksis, Devon, Lower St. Mary's along Riverside Drive back to Portobello Road, going west along the Queensway to Bell Street South.

Over the years we have seen many new faces in the Parish with the merger of churches and the increase of immigrants from all over the world and people moving from the west to our province. Since endemic Our Parish is becoming multicultural we see that in our pews, in our choir, lectors and altar servers in our weekend masses. It's clear to our eyes that the involvement of these people in each ministries, henceforth I encourage the same involvement in the Leadership of our Parish.

I am grateful for your support to Our Lady of Peace, the increased offertory, your involvement in various ministries, choir, lectors, catechists. I am happy to serve you for your spiritual nourishment. I like to serve you as we continue to grow in faith under the protection of Our Lady of Peace.

In the Fall of 2023 our Parish participated in the Disciple Maker Index Survey, lead by the Diocese. The participation from our parishioners was wonderful and truly appreciated. The information gathered in this survey has been complied and an advisory group has been established to look at the survey results and propose a plan of action and direction for the growth of our parish.



As members of Pastoral Council, we have been called to use our gifts to represent and discern the needs of our whole parish community and set parish direction by prayerful reflection and discussion. We are honoured by this privilege that has been bestowed upon us and we strive to serve our faith community.

Throughout the year pastoral council members discerned on many different opportunities and options to present to our parish community.

Through Advent and Lent we called on our various groups and the generosity of individuals to work together and help charities in our local community. The generosity and support of all involved has been overwhelming!

We supported and encouraged formation initiatives such as Movie and discussion evening, Catechist retreat, Family Faith Formation, The Catholic Parent sessions, Life Groups ministry, and free access to Formed.org a Catholic content platform that hosts thousands of movies, children's programs, eBooks, and more.

In celebration of Our Lady of Peace Feast Day a Grand celebration was hosted by your pastoral council and held in Stanley. The Stanley Fair Grounds was just the right size to have Sunday Mass and a catered lunch with entertainment for young and old.

In the Spring a few members of our parish were chosen to participate in Pope Francis' Synod on Synodality. This initiative for the Catholic Church is to collaboratively chart a path in the modern era, emphasizing listening, discernment and mission. This consisted of several reflection sessions with other parish representatives in the Diocese, using the guidelines of Spiritual Conversation.



## SACRAMENTS

The Catechism of the Catholic Church:

Article 2 The Paschal Mystery in the Church's Sacraments

1113 The whole liturgical life of the Church revolves around the Eucharistic sacrifice and the sacraments. There are seven sacraments in the Church: Baptism, Confirmation or Chrismation, Eucharist, Penance, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders, and Matrimony....

1114 "Adhering to the teaching of the Holy Scriptures, to the apostolic traditions and to the consensus... of the Fathers," we profess that "the sacraments of the new law were... all instituted by Jesus Christ out Lord".(Council of Trent)

### **Reconciliation and 1st Eucharist**

On April 28th, nineteen children received their 1st Holy Eucharist at the 11:00 am Mass at St. Theresa's Church. A reception was held after Mass for children and their families assisted by the CWL and parishioners.

Children are prepared for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and 1st Eucharist through a combination of at home lessons completed with parents, in person sessions with catechists and family workshops.



### **Confirmation Preparation**

On June 2nd Bishop Christian Riesbeck confirmed twenty-nine youth, including 6 Our Lady of Peace Parish youth, at a Regional Confirmation Mass at St. Theresa's Church.

A Confirmation Retreat for Confirmation Candidates from Our Lady of Peace, St. Mary Magdalene, and St. Kateri Tekakwitha Parishes was held on May 11th with Sr. Karen Kelly as retreat facilitator and Confirmation Catechists assisting.

In the fall of 2023, thirteen youth registered to begin the two-year Confirmation Preparation program and completed a 11-week online Alpha Youth Course with Confirmation Candidates and leaders from the Fredericton region (Our Lady of Peace, St. Kateri Tekakwitha and St. John Paul II Parishes). A retreat was held on November 25th at St. Theresa's Church. In January they began meeting monthly with Confirmation Leaders.



## LITURURICAL MINISTRIES

To carry out our weekly Sunday Masses as well as all other celebrations we rely on our liturgical ministers – altar servers, lectors, eucharistic, hospitality, sacristans, and choirs who willing volunteer their time to enhance our liturgies. We are always looking for more people to take part in these ministries and would encourage anyone interested to contact the office.





While we have 3 churches, we are one parish, Liturgical ministers are welcome and encouraged to serve in any of our 3 churches.

The Liturgy Committee of our Lady of Peace Parish consists of 6 parishioners of the parish and Fr. Maria. The Committee meets approximately 8 times a year. The focus of the committee has been the development of various lituraies for celebrations throughout the church year, the primary ones being our annual Mass of Remembrance in November, Advent, Christmas, Lent, Holy Week and Easter. We are also committed to developing li liturgies for special Masses, such as our Patron Saint Feast Days, Indigenous Days, and Development and Peace.





#### **MUSIC MINISTRY**

Music evokes a personal response from individuals and enhances our relationship with God. Many hours of practice and planning goes into providing wonderful music to our Masses. the sona and music encourages participation of all in the Mass. Our parish is truly blessed with an abundance of talent shared in this ministry. We thank all of those who volunteer their time and talent to lead us in lifting our voices to God.



#### LECTORS

Our Parish is blessed with many wonderful lectors. Being a lector is not just being able to read, the Word is to be proclaimed, yet not with theatrical show. This proclaiming the Good News is truly a gift that brings the Word of Christ and evokes worshippers to listen intently. This cannot be done without the belief that God's presence is in that Word.

#### **EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS**

Eucharistic Ministers are called to minister the Body and Blood of Christ, and to have and maintain a strong faith, and an inclusiveness of others as the foundation for their ministry. They must be comfortable in establishing a relationship with each communicant

Eucharistic Ministers are also asked to bring Holy Communion to people within the parish community who are sick and/or homebound. The experience in bringing the Body of Christ to others, who can not attend mass due to illness or other limitations, is truly a gift from God.

#### **SACRISTANS**

The role of Sacristan is to prepare the Sanctuary for the Mass this includes place chalices and ciboria, set out the bread and wine for offertory, light the candles, and dress the Altar with the correct colour. This may seem like a dull task but with our hands and our hearts these dull things become instruments of transformation.



#### **ALTAR SERVERS**

Altar Servers are a vital part of the liturgical ministry. They assist the priest at Mass, while at the same time help the faithful to prayerfully celebrate the Mass. This commitment is more than a task, responsibility or an honour, it is a holy service to the People of God. We are proud of the dedicated children and adults that we have serving in our churches.

## PARISH OUTREACH

Through various outreach opportunities Our Lady of Peace Parish has encouraged parishioners of all ages the opportunity of serving, giving and showing mercy. Aimed at making positive impact in the lives of individuals and groups outside of the church's immediate circle we have extended the hand of fellowship, support and love to our community.



### **TOUCHED BY CANCER MASS**

Touched by Cancer Mass takes place the 3rd Friday of the month at St. Anthony's Church. These monthly monthly Masses provide comfort and prayers of healing for those whose lives have been affected by cancer in any way.

### PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY

Several ladies in our parish gather once a month from October through May to knit shawls. These shawls are knit with love and prayers, and donated to the parish to be given to comfort those who are sick, grieving, or in need of solace. Once the shawls are completed they are blessed at our "Touched by Cancer Mass". If you or someone you know would be comforted by one of these shawls, they are available at the parish office free of charge.





### **MINISTRY OF CARE**

In March of 2024 we have been able to resume having Mass at York Manor following the pandemic. With the help of the Knights of Columbus and Lay Presiders. We are looking forward to offering Masses at Windsor Court, Eden Hall, Paradise Villa and Neil Hall once a month in starting in the fall.

Allison Wrynn is part of the Spiritual and Care Department at the DECH, and as such he visits patients and brings with him Prayers and Holy Communion to Catholic patients. He also visits Catholic's in our community requiring home care and residents at The Veterans Health Unit.

## COMMUNITY VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX PROGRAM

In collaboration with the Canada Revenue Agency, parish volunteer Steve Linton prepared and filed income tax returns for individuals who have a modest income and simple tax situation. This year he assisted 106 individuals to complete and file their income tax.

### LIFE GROUPS

The OLP Life Groups Ministry consists of smaller communities within the Parish (ideally groups of 6-12 parishioners) who desire to grow closer to Jesus in their walk of faith as His disciple. Participants desire to (1) grow in holiness, (2) respond more fully to the grace of the Holy Spirit, (3) strengthen each other in their spiritual journeys, and (4) mature in their understanding and living of their Catholic faith and the Gospel. Participation in OLP Life Groups offers meaningful encounters in sharing one another's faith journeys and can satisfy the desire for greater intimacy and fellowship among parishioners. Additionally, in response to the DMI, Life Groups Ministry will strive to develop participants' skills and confidence in giving witness to their faith and the Lord's work in their lives.

Weekly meetings were held on Thursday evenings between late September 14, 2023 - June 20, 2024. All meetings EXCEPT the third Thursday of the month were held on Zoom from 8:00 - 9:30 PM. Zoom meetings are open only to registered participants in the ministry. Meetings on the third Thursday of each month were in-person and open for anyone to join, typically by invitation by current participants. Meetings begin with participation in the Parish's Eucharistic Adoration from 6:30-7:30 PM; then all go out for a relaxed time of socializing in a local pub/restaurant in the community and the world.



Weekly Zoom meetings ranged from 4-12 participants, with an average of 6 people. Typically there were 2-3 men and 3-4 women at each session. The session with opens welcomina participants as they join the call, informal chit-chat, followed by an opening prayer, a reading, (videobased) content for individual reflection, a group discussion, and closing group prayer for the ministry participants' intentions as well as those of the parish, our community and the world.

## FAITH FORMATION

## Family Faith Formation (Catechism - Kindergarten to Grade 7)



with Sacrament Preparation for Reconciliation and 1st Eucharist in grade 2 During the 2023/2024 Formation year the parish continued with Family Faith Formation style delivery for catechism for families with children in kindergarten to grade seven. This model for faith formation focuses on family catechesis and coaching families to share and grow in faith together. Families met once or twice a month for in-person sessions at St. Theresa's Church using resources from Growing Up Catholic "Faith Stories." Attendance for sessions averaged twenty to thirty per session. Materials for home use were made available to families who were not able to attend sessions at St. Theresa's Church in person.

Throughout the summer of 2023 we participated in Diocesan meetings to share our experience of family catechesis and to look at options for adopting the model for the Diocese of Saint John.

Located in Miramichi serving all New Brunswick, it is responsible for the operation of summer camp for youth between the ages of 6-17 years.


